Author's note: DB indicates a digitally-recorded title that is found on the BARD website. This site is only available to borrowers who are patrons of the National Library Service for the Blind and Physically Handicapped. RC indicates a cassette book; BR, a book produced in braille; and RD, a book produced on rigid disc: a type of phonograph record, but a little smaller and played a bit more slowly than a standard album. Because the National Library Service, NLS, has been digitizing books at a rapid rate, many that I first read on cassette are now available in digital format. However, I have chosen to leave the RC designation in the bibliographic information below as a way to acknowledge this oncepopular format. Books that first appeared on cassette made up a huge part of the NLS collection during the majority of my reading years. I understand that NLS will also digitize RD titles at some point.
